

Altar Servers

This group is made up of adults and young people. The role of an altar server is to assist the priest at Holy Mass. The altar server has the responsibility to make preparations before the Mass starts. A young person should be mature enough to understand the responsibility of altar serving. Training takes place before important feasts on the calendar.


Holiday Group

Parish Fabric/Finance Committee

The committee helps and advises the parish priest in the administration of the goods of the parish. The group reflects and makes decisions over any financial and administrative matters relating to the parish and the people. The group meets once per month.

Parish Pastoral Team

Children's Liturgy

Liturgy of the Word for Children is a program in which the Sunday scripture readings are explained on a level appropriate to children at 9.30am Sunday mass from September until June. The children gather with their leaders in the front of the altar at the beginning of Mass and are sent forth by the presider. They process to Parish Hall which has been prepared for them for Children's Liturgy. Following this, the children return to the church at the time of the Presentation of the Gifts.
