THE EASTER VIGIL

The Easter Vigil is in Four Parts

PART ONE: THE LUCERNARIUM

New fire is kindled and blessed. From that fire comes the light for the Easter Candle symbolising Christ who dispels the darkness of the night. As the Paschal Candle is processed, the following is sung three times: *Lumen Christi*. We answer: ***Deo Gratias***. The Candle is placed high on the sanctuary and the joyful song of the Easter Proclamation (Exultet) is sung, as we rejoice in all that this light symbolises for us and for our world in the new life of Christ.

PART TWO: THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

The story of our salvation is told once more. We relive the story. As we listen to the Old Testament narrative our trust in the promise of redemption and hope for men and women is rekindled.

PART THREE: THE LITURGY OF BAPTISM

Through our baptism we share in the risen life of Christ and are called to share in his work of redeeming the world. Tonight we recall our own baptism, renewing our personal baptismal promises and reflecting on their significance for us.

PART FOUR: THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

We are fully united with Christ and nurtured for our journey until we are one with him in our own resurrection. This is the night of all nights to give thanks and praise to our heavenly Father.
