Track and Trace: All Parishioners attending Mass should email their names, addresses and telephone numbers to the bulletin email address: bulletin@sbek.org. This is a requirement of the Scottish Government as laid out in the Guidelines.

As we went into Level 0 from on Monday 19 July, the following rules are in place:

- Social distancing has been reduced to 1 metre, therefore the number of Mass attendees will increase. The revised number will be announced in due course. ***Please note that Masses must still be booked in the same manner as before.***
- The increase in attendees will put more pressure on the stewards. Please make their job easier by following their seating instructions.
- To reduce congestion at the front door, ***we ask that Parishioners arrive at the Church at least 15 minutes before the beginning of Mass.*** This will allow the stewards to book Parishioners in, and show them to their seats in time for for Mass starting.
- Face masks must still be worn, unless medically exempt.
- Public singing is allowed, but face masks must be worn.
- Sanitisation is still of the upmost importance, therefore please continue to use the sanitiser when entering and leaving the Church.
- The distribution of Holy Communion is as follows: Stewards will usher the parishioners sitting in the pews in the Side Chapel first. Ushers will then approach the central aisle and commence with the right hand pews facing the Altar, and then continue with the parishioners on the left hand side of the Altar. ***For the avoidance of doubt, parishioners will approach the Altar using the central aisle, and return to their seats by the side aisles.*** After receiving Holy Communion parishioners are to make their way back to their seats.

With the return of Fr Rafal, Holy Mass will be said every morning at 10.00 am.
