QUEEN ELIZABETH AND THE PAPACY

We have heard much comment over the past few days since the death of Queen Elizabeth that during her reign she had known 'fifteen prime ministers', from Winston Churchill through to the present incumbent, Liz Truss. From a Roman Catholic perspective, it is interesting to note that she reigned during the Pontificate of seven Popes - Pius XII, Saint John XXII, Saint Paul VI, Blessed John Paul I, Saint John Paul II, Benedict XVI and Francis, four of whom she met personally.



Princess Elizabeth, as she was then, visited the Vatican for the first time in 1951, when she met with Pope Pius XII. Her first as visit as Sovereign was on the 5 May, ten years later, in 1961, when she was received in a private audience by Pope Saint John XXIII.

In 1980 she visited the Vatican City State, and was received by Pope Saint John Paul II, who two years later would travel to the United Kingdom on an Apostolic Visit. The Pope was given an audience by the Queen at Buckingham Palace. She would go on to meet the Polish Pontiff for a third time, in the year 2000, the Year of the Great Jubilee, in Rome.

In 2010, when Pope Benedict XVI, came on a State Visit to Great Britain, his aircraft was met at Edinburgh Airport by Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh. The Pontiff was received at an official Welcome Ceremony by Queen Elizabeth at Holyrood House (which is the Medieval name for the 'Holy Cross').

Her last meeting with a Pontiff was in 2014, when she was received in a private audience by Pope Francis in the Paul VI Audience Hall at the Vatican. **Father McGachey**

CALENDAR

Monday is the memorial of the *Holy Name of Mary*. In line with Jewish custom, Our Lady's parents named her eight days after her birth and called her Mary (or Myriam in Hebrew). The feast originated in Spain and was approved by Rome in the sixteenth century. Saint Bernard famously wrote in the eleventh century: "Call upon Mary ... in danger, in distress, in doubt, call upon Mary. May her name never be far from your lips."

We remember *Saint John Chrysostom* on **Tuesday**. Born in Antioch, Syria, his eloquence earned him the surname of 'Chrysostom', or 'golden mouthed'. As Archbishop of Constantinople, his courageous stance against the vices of the royal court, caused him to be exiled several times, where he would die in 407.

On **Wednesday** we keep the *Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross*. Today we remember the finding of the True Cross on which Our Lord hung, by Saint Helena, the mother of the emperor Constantine, in the fourth century.

We honour Our Lady, under the title *Our Lady of Sorrows* on **Thursday**. This devotion has its roots in the Bible and Christian piety, which always associates Mary with her suffering Son. The seven sorrows of Mary are: the prophecy of Simeon; the flight into Egypt; the loss of the child Jesus; meeting Our Lord on the way to Calvary; the Crucifixion; the taking down of the dead body of Jesus from the cross and his burial in the tomb.

Friday is the memorial of *Saints Cornelius, Pope and Cyprian, Priest*. Cornelius had to oppose the heretic Novatian, who believed that Christians, who having denied the Faith to

save themselves from persecution, and who later repented, could not be readmitted to the Church. He was helped by Cyprian, a brilliant theologian and defender of his Papacy.
