Ukraine Appeal: We are happy to say that our first lorry left for Caritas Siedlce in Poland on Wednesday 16 March, and had a wonderful send off. Pictures can be seen on our Facebook and Twitter pages. The lorry safely reached its destination on Friday. Big 'thank you' goes to SG Plant Hire and Kevin Quinn for transporting donations free of any charge. Caritas Siedlce supports both Ukrainian war refugees who came to Poland and people who stayed in Ukraine facing the unknown. We hope to have our second lorry packed and ready to go by this week. At the moment we have to notify you that we kindly ask you not to bring any more clothes. Much needed and wanted for the Ukrainian war refugees is food, toiletries and medicines. We will be stopping taking donations for two to three weeks after Tuesday 22 March. This is to allow us to catch up with packing the donations that we have. There is quite a lot of paperwork which must be done before sending a lorry abroad and we have to do this. When we start taking donations again, we will announce it on our Facebook and Twitter pages. Our Ukrainian Refugee Appeal has already been a big success and we all can be very proud of ourselves. All progress will be posted on our Parish FB and Twitter pages. This war in Ukraine is the biggest humanitarian crisis since WW2. As of Thursday 17 March there were 2 millions Ukrainian war refugees in Poland of which nearly two thousand were taken straight to hospitals. Among those two thousands ill refugees just over one thousand are children. And the numbers continue to rise. Thank you for all that you are doing to support the innocent people in Ukraine who are suffering because of the war. Please, remember the people of Ukraine and those who pass away, in your prayers.

Rosary for Peace: On Friday 25 March a Rosary for Peace in the Ukraine will be held in George Square, Glasgow at 6.30pm. On the day that Pope Francis will concentrate Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, please come along to George

Square at 6.30pm and join with Archbishop Nolan and the other Scottish Bishops in praying the Holy Rosary for Peace in the Ukraine and for all those affected by this tragic conflict.

Children's Liturgy - First Communion Preparation: Over the four Sundays in March, commencing 6 March, the Children's Liturgy Group will run sacramental preparation for children who will be making their First Communion this spring. This will be held in the Parish Hall at 9.30 am each Sunday, with the children returning to Mass in the Church around 10.00 am.

Monsignor Thomas O'Hare: It is with great sadness that we announce that Monsignor Thomas O'Hare passed away following a lengthy illness. He died in the Parish House at St Anthony's in Rutherglen where he resided following his retirement. Monsignor O'Hare was born in Motherwell on 16 October 1935, and ordained in Motherwell on 29 June 1959. He served in a number of parishes in the diocese: as Assistant Priest in St Margaret's Airdrie, Our Lady and St Joseph's Glenboig, St John Bosco New Stevenston and St Mary's Hamilton; and as Parish Priest in St Benedict's Easterhouse, St Serf's Airdrie and, latterly, in Our Lady and St Anne's in Hamilton until his retirement in 2014. The funeral arrangements are as follows: Reception of the Body at St Anthony's Church Rutherglen on Sunday **20 March at 6.30 pm** with the Funeral Mass at St Anthony's on **Monday 21 March at 12 noon**.
