
# TWENTY-ONE NEW CARDINALS FOR THE CHURCH

Pope Francis announced last Sunday at the end of the Angelus address in Saint Peter's Square, that he would hold a Consistory for the creation of new Cardinals on the 8<sup>th</sup> of December 2024, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. He will create twenty-one new cardinals, twenty of them are under the age of eighty, and would be eligible to enter a conclave to elect a pope.

This will bring the number of Cardinal electors up to 141. Pope Saint Paul VI in 1975 ruled that there should not be more than 120 cardinal electors at any one time. Pope Saint John Paul II, Pope Benedict XVI and now Pope Francis regularly exceeded that limit. The consistory to create new Cardinals in December will be the tenth time Pope Francis has distributed red hats since his election in March 2013.

With the new intake, the average age of the Cardinals electors will decrease to seventy. People often speak of Pope Francis going to the "peripheries" when he chooses new cardinals. And he did the same this time. For example, Belgium-born Archbishop Dominique Mathieu of Tehran, is the first head of an Iranian diocese to be made a cardinal. But the pope also put six countries that have had cardinal electors previously back on the list by naming archbishops ministering in or born in Algeria, Australia, Ecuador, Lithuania, Peru and Serbia.

After the consistory in December, more than seventy countries will be represented among the cardinal electors. In the 2013 conclave that elected Pope Francis, the 115 cardinals who entered the Sistine Chapel to vote came from forty-eighth countries.



Pope Francis' choices over time also have ended the European dominance of electors the in College of Cardinals. Only 40% of the current Cardinal electors are European. The percentage of Cardinal electors from Asia will rise to 19%. Latin follow Americans with 17% and

Africans will make up close to 13% of the electors. The fourteen cardinals from the United States and Canada make up about 10% of the electors and the four from Oceania represent just under 3%.

More than half of the twenty-one cardinals are members of religious orders, which will bring to seventy the number of the world's cardinals who trained and ministered as

members of religious communities or congregations. Although neither order will have new cardinals, the Salesians will still lead the list with eleven cardinals, followed by the Jesuits with nine. Here is a list of the future Cardinals:

# THE COMMEMORATION OF THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED - ALL SOULS' DAY

## **CALENDAR**

On Wednesday we remember Saint Margaret Mary Alacogue (+1690), the Visitation nun, to whom Our Lord revealed his Sacred Heart and made a series of promises for those who would keep the special the First Fridays of each month. Thursday is the memorial of Saint Ignatius Bishop of Antioch (+107), a disciple of Saint John the apostle, who was condemned to be killed by wild beasts in the Rome amphitheatre. On his journey in chains to Rome he wrote seven letters to local churches, which provide us with a snapshot of the Christian Church of his time. On Friday we have the feast of Saint Luke, evangelist and physician. On Saturday we remember the Martyrs of North America Saints Issac Joques and John de Brébeuf (+1642, +1649), Jesuit priests and their companions, who were killed by native Indians in upstate New York.
