# A NEW *LECTIONARY* FOR SCOTLAND

Over the past few months, I have been working along with a group of other priests in Scotland, at correcting the proofs for the new *Lectionary* which will be used in our parishes from the 1<sup>st</sup> December this year. The *Lectionary* is name of the book which contains the Scripture readings which the reader proclaims at Mass.



The new *Lectionary* is being introduced as part of a wider revision of Liturgical translations in the UK: the *Roman Missal* with its new texts and responses was introduced in 2011, and *The Rite of Confirmation* and The *Rite of Marriage* have also been revised and introduced.

The changes to the *Lectionary* have made use of up-to-date Biblical scholarship; the translations are more faithful to the original Biblical languages; and the dignity and accessibility of

language, needed for a worthy proclamation of the Word of God, has been paramount, so that the texts will be more easily proclaimed.

After consultation with several English-speaking Conferences of Bishops, our Bishops, in conjunction with the Bishops of England and Wales, chose the *Catholic Edition* of the *English Standard Version* (ESV) of the Bible produced by the Catholic Bishops' Conference of India. In India, with this text, they have produced a new *Lectionary* which has been approved by the Holy See.

The Psalms play an important part of the *Lectionary*. Up until now we have been using the so-called *Grail* translation. This has been revised by the United States Conference of Bishops, reflecting developments in the understanding of the texts, while maintaining the poetry and rhythm of the Psalms themselves. This revision was finalised in 2021 and published by under the title of *Abbey Psalms and Canticles*. This revised translation will be incorporated into the new *Lectionary*.

Another significant change to the *Lectionary* will be its layout: the readings will be laid out in so-called 'sense lines', phrase by phrase, sentence by sentence - this is to help the reader make more sense of the text. As a result, the layout will require more space, and this means more pages. So, while the current *Lectionary*, has three volumes; the new *Lectionary* will have four volumes: Volume One: Sundays and Feasts of Our Lord. Volume Two: Advent, Christmas, Ordinary Time (weeks 1-9), Lent, Easter, and Proper of Saints (December - May), Volume Three: Ordinary Time (Weeks 10-34), Proper of Saints (June - November). Volume Four: Ritual Masses, Votive Masses and Masses for the Dead.

Another important change is that the *Lectionary* will have an up-to-date Proper of Saints - since 1981, many Saints days have been added to the Universal Calendar of the Church, as well as feasts that belong to the National Calendars of each country.

The new *Lectionary* will be published by The Catholic Truth Society (CTS) in London, and will be used in England and Wales too. The projected cost for the four volumes is approximately £700. CTS and other publishers will be producing people's Missals in due course including Sunday and Daily Missals. **Father McGachey**

This Thursday, 9<sup>th</sup> of May, is the Fortieth day after Easter, the Feast of the Ascension of Our Lord into heaven. **This is a Holyday of Obligation in Scotland** - a day when we are expected to celebrate the Feast by attending Holy Mass.

Masses will be celebrated at the following times: Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> May at 7pm, Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> at 10am and at 2pm in Saint Kenneth's Primary School.

#### **CALENDAR**

Friday is the feast of Saint Damien of Molokai (+1889). He was a missionary of the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary who is revered by Hawaiians for having dedicated his life in service of the lepers of the island of Molokai. Friday is the memorial of Saint John of Avila. Known as the Apostle of Andalusia (Spain) and the spiritual advisor of Saint Teresa of Avila and Saint John of the Cross amongst others. After studying law at the University of Salamanca, he was ordained to the Priesthood and drew great crowds not only because of his fiery sermons but also because of his compassion and care. His writings have become classics of the Spanish language.
