

THE INAUGURATION OF THE PAPACY OF POPE LEO XIV

oday, the Fifth Sunday oi Eastertide, the Solemn Inauguration Mass of the Pontificate of Leo XIV will take place in Saint Peter's Square at 10am (9am UK time). It will be broadcast live on TV, at least of the rolling news channels, and internet -vaticanmedialive.com, to be played back at any time. The Mass will be attended by Monarchs and Political leaders from around the world, including Prince Edward, the Duke of Edinburgh, representing the United Kingdom; as well as the family of Pope Leo, including his two brothers, who have figured prominently in the media over the past week or so, and up to one hundred thousand faithful.

The Mass begins with the Pope's visit to Saint Peter's tomb underneath the Papal Altar in the Basilica for a few moments of prayer. Leo will incense the Pallium and the Fisherman's Ring, the two distinguishing symbols of the Pontiff's office, which will have been placed on top of the tomb overnight. They will then be carried by Deacons, in a long procession of more than two hundred cardinals, while the ninth century *Laudes Regiae* (the Royal Praises), a long hymn of acclamations and invocations of the Saints, punctuated by the famous refrain: *Christus vincit*, *Christus regnat*, *Christus imperat* (Christ conquers, Christ reigns, Christ commands) is sung.

At the beginning of Mass, the Pallium and Fisherman's ring are formally presented to the Holy Father.



The Pallium is a sign of office in the Latin Church, worn by the Pope and by Metropolitan Archbishops (Bishops who oversee an Ecclesiastical provinces of several dioceses). It is a white woollen band, shaped into a circle, which lies over the shoulders, with bands extending down the front and the back. There are six crosses embroidered on it, and it is tipped in black silk, front and back. The Pallium is a symbol of jurisdiction: the Pope always wears it wherever he goes throughout the world. Metropolitan Archbishops only wear theirs within their territory

and only as long as they hold the office, never after retirement. The Pallium is a reminder of the ministry of the Good Shepherd, who carries the sheep over his shoulder, and is reminiscent of the *feedbag* which the shepherd feeds his sheep from - a duty the Pope has of feeding the flock with the Word of God. It is also symbolic of the yoke of Christ, a burden which the Pope shoulders in looking after the Church. The Pallium is presented to the Holy Father by the Cardinal Protodeacon, the Frenchman, Dominique Mamberti.



The Fisherman's Ring or *anulus piscatoris* in Latin, will be presented to Pope Leo by the Cardinal Camerlengo, the Irish born American, Kevin Farrell. The Pope is the Successor of Saint Peter, who, according to the Gospels, was a fisherman. The ring is a signet ring, which features Saint Peter fishing from a boat. Until the mid-eighteen hundreds it was used to seal official documents bearing the Pope's signature, which were sealed in red wax. The ring was first used in the time of Pope Clement IV, in the thirteenth century. Nowadays, a new ring is cast for each

Pope, and the design features an image of Saint Peter, along with an inscription of the Pope's name in Latin. Historically, upon the death of a Pope, the ring is destroyed using a hammer, in the presence of the College of Cardinals.



The Holy See Press Office released the official explanation of Pope Leo XIV's coat of arms last Wednesday. It includes the traditional Papal symbols of the Crossed Keys of Saint Peter and Episcopal Mitre or headgear. The upper left-hand corner of the shield bears a silver fleur-de-lis set against a light blue background: the blue field evokes the heavens and is distinguished by its Marian significance, with the lily appearing as the classic symbol of Our Lady. On the bottom right, a red heart, topped by a flame and pierced by an arrow, sit atop a red book framed by an ivory background: this is the emblem of the Order of Saint Augustine, of which Pope Leo XIV served as Prior General for

two terms. The image recalls words from Saint Augustine's autobiography, *The Confessions: "Sagittaveras* [from the same root as the word Sagittarius, meaning 'archer'} cor meum charitate tua" ("You pierced my heart with your love"). The book recalls the enlightened writing of Augustine, bestowed upon the Church. Pope Leo XIV's motto *In illo uno unum unum* (In the One, we are one). The motto echoes Augustine's sermon on Psalm 127, where he explains that "although we Christians are many, in the one Christ we are one."
