Bulletin for the Solemnity of All Saints 2nd November 2025

FRIENDS, NOT STATUES...

Philomena (+c.299), Saint Bernadette of Lourdes (+1879), Saint Maria Goretti (+1902) and Pope Saint Pius X (+1914). We are blessed to have these Relics at Saint Bride's, and during this past week they have been displayed in a more worthy way, above the vesting bench, in the sacristy. After Mass, please approach the altar, to see them up close; if you have children, take them too; touch the relic, and make the Sign of the Cross, and ask the Saint to pray for you and to help you.

This Sunday in Scotland we are keeping the Solemnity of All Saints. During the course of a Liturgical Year, the Church celebrates, one by one, the feasts of the Saints, those who are

well-known, and those who are perhaps less so. Today She unites them all in one festival - the Solemnity of All Saints, recalling the words of Saint John in the Book of Revelation, where he sees a magnificent vision of people in heaven "from every tribe and tongue and people and nation" who "stand before the throne of the Lamb, clothed with white robes" proclaiming God's praises. The radiance and splendour of the feast is in sharp contrast dark and sinister tones of Halloween!

The commemoration of All Saints in one feast goes back to the early centuries. Initially, Christians would remember Martyrs on the anniversary of their death - their heavenly birthday (dies natalis) to eternal life. But as the number of martyrs grew during persecutions in Rome and beyond, it became difficult to



assign a specific day to everyone who died for the Faith. Therefore, beginning in the fourth century, the Church established a common day to honour all martyrs. In 609, Pope Boniface IV consecrated to God the Pantheon in Rome, the Pagan Temple to all gods of Rome, built by the Emperor Hadrian in 125AD. He dedicated it to Our Lady and all the Martyrs. Later, Pope Gregory III (+741) consecrated a chapel in Saint Peter's Basilica to all the Saints and moved the celebration to the 1st of November, and so the feast spread throughout the Church.

In our own day, the formal process for a person to be declared a Saint - Canonisation - has three phases:

PHASE I - Five years must pass from the time of a person's death before a cause for Sainthood may begin; this allows greater objectivity. The Pope can dispense from this if he chooses. The Bishop in whose Diocese the person died is responsible for beginning the investigation into their life. A *Petitioner* asks the Bishop, through a person known as the *Postulator*, to open the investigation. The Bishop forms a Diocesan Tribunal to investigate the martyrdom or how the candidate lived a life of heroic virtues, that is, the *Theological Virtues* of faith, hope and charity, and the *Cardinal Virtues* of prudence, justice, temperance and fortitude. Witnesses are called and evidence is gathered about the person in question.

PHASE II - Once the Diocesan stage has finished, the documentation is sent to the *Congregation for the Causes of Saints* in Rome. A summary is prepared a Postulator residing in Rome and examined by a group of nine theologians. If the majority of them are in favour, the cause is passed on for examination by Cardinals and Bishops who are members of the *Congregation*. If their judgment is favourable, the *Prefect* of the Congregation presents the results to the Pope, who gives his approval, stating that the Congregation draft a Decree saying either: the person is *Venerable* (if they have lived a virtuous life) or *Blessed* (if they have been martyred). For the *Beatification* of a *Venerable*, a miracle attributed to their intercession is necessary. For a martyr, no miracle is required.

PHASE III - For Canonisation or declaration of Sainthood, another miracle is needed for both *Blessed Martyrs* and *Venerabili*, after his or her Beatification. Canonisation allows veneration of the new Saint by the universal Church.

Today's Solemnity should inspire us with hope: for among the Saints, apart from those we look up to, whose life stories we know and love, in heaven are people who touched our lives - from our families and and circle of friends and acquaintances. They lived lives like our own: they were marked with the sign of faith in Baptism, they tried to live by the values of Christ, and they have gone before us, making that final journey we will have to make one day. Where they are, we hope to follow! May they intercede for us! Father McGachey
