CHRISTUS VINCIT, CHRISTUS REGNAT, CHRISTUS IMPERAT

he above words are taken from the famous Laudes Regiae (Royal Praises), a long hymn of acclamations and invocations, punctuated by the famous refrain: Christus vincit, Christus regnat, Christus imperat (Christ conquers, Christ reigns, Christ commands). It is the hymn, par excellence, for today's Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, the King of the Universe, and the last Sunday of the liturgical year. As King, Christ claims dominion over all creation and his kingdom of justice and peace, grows from strength to strength.



"LONG LIVE CHRIST THE KING ... " - SAINT JOSELITO

n 1926, the Mexican Government's restrictions on the freedom of religion and conscience forced the faithful in the country to come out and defend their faith in dramatic fashion. It was a time of bullets, death, and persecutions.

Amid the noise of war, could be heard the voice of a fifteen-year-old boy, who walked to his grave shouting "Long live Christ the King!"

Refusing to give up his Catholic faith, José Sánchez del Río, or Joselito (little Joe) as he was commonly called, died a martyr in the *Cristeros* War that shook Mexico between 1926 and 1929. It is reckoned that around a quarter of a million lives were lost during this dark period in Mexico's past.

Joselito's childhood was that of a normal boy: he went to school and had a knack for making friends. His family, from Michoacán, was pious and active in the local parish. His parents' living faith was the basis of his holiness.



Having gained the approval of his parents to join the *Cristeros* Movement - the response of Catholics in Mexico to the secularist, anticlerical political regime, led by the politician, Plutarco Calles, in control of the country in those days.

José had to convince the Movement's leader that he was mature enough to be part of the organisation. In fact, his first request was refused. But José did not give up. He persisted and offered himself as an assistant, which the leader accepted. At the *Cristeros*

camp, Joselito encouraged the others to pray the Rosary daily. He cheered up his companions by his good humour, and won their admiration by his hard work. They nicknamed him Tarcissius, after the Roman martyr, who when in his teens, was attacked and killed by the Roman mob while carrying the Blessed Sacrament in 295AD.

On the 6th of February 1928, he was taken prisoner by government troops. Joselito was easy to catch because he had given his horse to his General while they were in battle.


From prison, before his death, he wrote the following moving letter to his mother: "I was taken prisoner in combat today. I believe I am going to die, but nothing matters, Mother. Resign yourself to God's will. I'm dying very happy because I'm dying in the fight next to Our Lord. Don't worry about my death. Rather tell my other brothers to follow the example of the youngest son, and you: do the will of God. Have courage and send me your blessing, together with that of my father. Greet everyone for me for the last time and receive for the last time the heart of your son who loves you so much and wanted to see you before dying."

At 11pm on the 10th of February, José Sánchez del Rio walked to the cemetery, with the soles of his feet, which had been flayed, in agony. Even in pain, José did not deny his faith. Standing in front of his open grave, and without giving in to those who tried to get him to deny Christ, he shouted out one last time "Long live Christ the King! Long live the Virgin of Guadalupe!" What an example in life and death of loyalty to Christ, the Universal King and Our Blessed Lady! A true role model, who deserves to be more widely known.

José was raised to the altars as a saint by the late Pope Francis on the 16th of October 2016. His story from the 1920's is one of the many testimonies of Mexicans who helped to keep the Catholic faith alive in their country in the face of tremendous opposition. **Father McGachey**

THE SEASONS OF ADVENT AND CHRISTMASTIDE AT SAINT BRIDE'S PARISH

ADVENT BEGINS NEXT SUNDAY

The Season of Advent and the New Liturgical Year begin next Sunday. The world around us is ready to celebrate Christmas, but the Church invites us to resist the temptation for four weeks and make the Advent Season a time growing towards the Lord and preparing for his return.

Please make Advent a holy time for yourselves and your families, by joining us at the special seasonal liturgies. Find time to make a good Confession, too, as a preparation for the worthy celebration of the Christmas Feasts.

THE RORATE CAELI MASS

Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays at 7am

his Advent, our parish will celebrate a special Mass, commonly known as a *Rorate Caeli* Mass. Deeply rooted in the history of the Church, after a period of decline, it is enjoying a resurgence in recent times.



What is a Rorate Caeli Mass?

Rorate Caeli is Latin for "Drop down, you heavens", and is a phrase taken from the Prophet Isaiah 45,8. The Mass is traditionally celebrated just before dawn during Advent, in honour of Our Blessed Lady. The Church is illuminated by candles to highlight Mary's role in bringing the Eternal Light, Jesus Christ, into the darkness of the world.

As the Mass progresses, the Church becomes brighter, until the rising sun fills it with the light of day. As a Votive Mass of Our Blessed Lady is said, white vestments are worn instead of the violet normally used during Advent. The Mass prayers and readings highlight the prophecies about the coming of the

Messiah and Mary's role in bringing Christ into the world.

A *Rorate Caeli* Mass will be celebrated in our neighbouring parish of Our Lady of Lourdes on the Tuesdays and Thursdays of Advent at 7am.

DEVOTIONS IN HONOUR OF OUR LADY

Mondays 1st, 8th, 15th and 22nd December at 7pm

ollowing on from our popular weekly Devotions in honour of Our Lady in October and for the Holy Souls in November, we will have special Advent Devotions in honour of the Mother of God, on the Mondays the Season at 7pm.

Gathered at Our Lady's altar we will offer her our day: our joys and sorrows, and ask her to present them to her Son, while commending ourselves to her protection and guidance.

After reciting the Angelus, we will form a torchlight procession and move off to the main part of the Church, where we will recite the Holy Rosary, the Litany of Loreto and conclude with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.



SATURDAY 13th AND SUNDAY 14th DECEMBER FEAST OF SAINT LUCY - PATRON OF EYESIGHT

fter Mass on Saturday morning, and at the three weekend Masses for the Third Sunday of Advent, we will offer individual blessings with Relic of Saint Lucy. Her name means 'light' in Latin, and for this reason, the fourth century martyr is invoked as the Patron Saint of good eyesight and for interceding for those with problems with their vision. Please come to receive a blessing today.


SIMPLE VESPERS OR EVENING PRAYER FOR ADVENT

Sundays, Tuesdays and Wednesday at 7pm

nce the preserve of the great monasteries of the Middle Ages, where it was chanted by the communities of monks, Vespers is one of the five Divine Offices, recited by Priests and many Religious and lay people across the world.

This year we will pray simple Vespers, by candlelight, before Our Lady's Altar.

It includes an Advent Hymn, two Psalms from the Old Testament and a Canticle from the New Testament. Followed by a short Scripture
