THE SEASON OF ADVENT 2025

oday marks the beginning of the Season of Advent and new Liturgical Year. The word Advent comes from the Latin phrase Adventus Domini and simply means 'the Coming of the Lord'.



THE TWO 'COMINGS' OF OUR LORD

The Season, which spans the period from today until Christmas Eve, has a twofold character, in which Lord's *two Comings* are remembered: his First Coming as a child at Bethlehem. Likewise, his Second Coming at the end of time, to bring the world to its completion.

THE COLOUR OF THE SEASON

The liturgical colour of Advent is purple - not the 'royal' purple of Lent, which is rich and vivid in tone, but 'indigo' purple, which is much paler. Historically, the indigo purple of Advent was 'bluer' in tone - a nod to Our Blessed Lady, whose role in the first Advent was so important when she carried in her womb, the Messiah, sent from heaven. This year we will use a new 'indigo' set of Sunday and Weekday chasubles (Mass vestments worn by the priest), a cope or cloak, for use at the evening services and matching tabernacle veil. The purple of Advent underlines the *preparatory* nature of the Season: Advent is *not* a penitential time like Lent, but a period of joyful expectation.

THE USE OF SILVER RATHER THAN GOLD

Following a long-standing tradition of the Church, we will use silver furnishings (candlesticks, processional Cross and thurible etc.) as well as sacred vessels (chalice, ciboria, lavabo jug etc.) this year. This tradition fell into disuse for a considerable period, but in recent years it is enjoying something of a renaissance across the Catholic world. Silver underlines the restrained mood of the Advent Season; a prelude to the joy and glory of Christmastide.

THE ADVENT WREATH

One of the symbols of the Season is the Advent Wreath, with its evergreens, red berries and four candles. The evergreens represent the life of God which is everlasting and always new; the red berries represent the blood that Christ shed for our sake on the Cross; and the four candles, representing the four Sundays of Advent, with three purple candles and one rose-coloured candle, used on *Gaudete* (or Rejoice) Sunday - the Third Sunday of Advent - the halfway stage in the Season. The Wreath will be blessed at all Masses this weekend.

WHAT ARE WE DOING AT SAINT BRIDE'S TO MAKE ADVENT A SPECIAL TIME? SIMPLE VESPERS OR EVENING PRAYER - SUNDAYS, TUESDAYS AND WEDNESDAYS 7pm



This year we will pray simple Vespers, by candlelight, before Our Lady's Altar. It includes an Advent Hymn, two Psalms from the Old Testament and a Canticle from the New Testament. Followed by a short Scripture Reading, a brief reflection, Mary's canticle of praise from Saint Luke's Gospel, known as the *Magnificat*. It concludes with Intercessions, the Lord's Prayer, a Concluding Prayer and Blessing. It will last no longer than thirty minutes and

is the perfect way to end the day the day, giving thanks for its blessings and praying for God's continual help in the new day that begins tomorrow. Please join us.

The Rorate Caeli Mass - Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays at 7am

The Mass is traditionally celebrated just before dawn, in honour of Our Blessed Lady. The Church is illuminated by candles to highlight Mary's role in bringing the Eternal Light, Jesus Christ, into the darkness of the world. Last year this Mass was very well attended, We hope it will be this year too. A *Rorate Caeli* Mass will be celebrated in our neighbouring parish of Our Lady of Lourdes on the Tuesdays and Thursdays of Advent at 7am.





DEVOTIONS IN HONOUR OF OUR LADY - Mondays 1^{st} , 8^{th} , 15^{th} and 22^{nd} December 7pm

Gathered at Our Lady's altar we will offer her our day: our joys and sorrows, and ask her to present them to her Son, while commending ourselves to her protection and guidance.

After reciting the Angelus, we will form a torchlight procession and move off to the main part of the Church, where we will recite the Holy Rosary, the Litany of Loreto and conclude with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

MONDAY 8th OF DECEMBER - SOLEMNITY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION - MASS FOR THE SICK

he Solemnity recalls how Our Lady, when she was conceived in her mother, Saint Anne's, womb, was preserved from all stain of Original Sin. She was immaculately conceived - because she was destined to be the Mother of God. Our 10am Mass on that day will be a Solemn Mass with organ and incense. During Mass, the Anointing with Oil of the Sacrament of the Sick will be given.

SATURDAY 13th AND SUNDAY 14th DECEMBER FEAST OF SAINT LUCY -PATRON OF THE SENSE OF SIGHT

After Mass on Saturday morning, and at the three weekend Masses for the Third Sunday of Advent, we will offer individual blessings with Relic of Saint Lucy. Her name means 'light' in Latin, and for this reason, the fourth century martyr is invoked as the Patron Saint of good eyesight and for interceding for those with problems with their vision. Please come to receive a blessing today.
