
HONOURING OUR LADY IN OCTOBER...MONTH OF THE ROSARY

ctober means 'eighth month' in Latin: in the old Roman calendar the year began in Spring not in Winter. October for Roman Catholics is the month of the Holy Rosary, a time when we honour the Mother of God...What does the wisdom of the Saints say about Our Lady?



The Rosary...the prayer loved by countless saints...simple, yet profound...with the Rosary the Christian people sits at the school of Mary and is led to contemplate the beauty of the face of Christ. Through the Rosary, the faithful receive abundant graces, as though from the very hands of the Mother of the Redeemer. **Pope Saint John Paul II (+2005)**

If the storms of temptation arise, if you crash against the rock of tribulations: look to the Star, and call upon Mary. MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY



On Monday evening at 7pm we will have the first of our **October Devotions** in honour of Our Lady for the month of the Rosary. The service will include: a Torchlight Procession, the recitation of the Rosary, the Litany of Loreto, the prayer to Saint Joseph for the Universal Church and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, accompanied with the organ and the use of incense. Please join us as we honour the Mother of God during this special month. On the Mondays of October, we will not recite the Rosary before 10am Mass, since it will be said in the evening, but have a quiet time of adoration of the Blessed Sacrament for personal prayer instead.

PARISH PILGRIMAGE TO ROME

Father Martin leads a group of around thirty-five parishioners on pilgrimage to Rome beginning tomorrow. We wish them a safe journey and ask for their prayers at the holy places of the Eternal City. The group comes back on Friday. Father Martin leaves on the same day to represent Bishop Toal in the Holy Land on a pilgrimage with Knights of the Holy Sepulchre. He returns on the 18th October.

CALENDAR

Tuesday is the memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary, kept on the date of the Battle of Lepanto (1571) in which the Christian fleet defeated the Turkish fleet and halted its expansion into Europe. The victory was attributed to the recitation of the Rosary. Thursday is the memorial of Saint Denis and Companions (+258). Denis was Bishop of Paris, and suffered martyrdom there, together with priest Rusticus and deacon Eleutherius. It is also the memorial of Saint John Henry Cardinal Newman (+1890). Saturday is the memorial of Pope Saint John XXIII (+1963). Elected in 1958, and best known for convening the Second Vatican Council. He was beatified by Pope Saint John Paul II in 2000. His feast is assigned to the day on which the Second Vatican Council opened in 1962.
